True Discipleship

Many saints discover the truth conveyed in the first reading from the Book of Wisdom that "the corruptible body burdens the soul, and the earthen shelter weighs down the mind that has many concerns." Many holy men and women arrive at a point in their lives when they admit a deep dissatisfaction with the pursuit of earthly possessions.

From time to time, we too have a similar experience when the things we so desired yesterday no longer satisfy us today! This recognition of dissatisfaction with material things can be a moment of grace when we turn, once



again, to God as the supreme source of the happiness we long for. The life of St Francis of Assisi is a good example.

In the Gospel, Jesus describes attitudes that mark a Christian disciple. He says, "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." Then, Jesus says, "anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." Jesus notes that our relationship to God is more fundamental than even our closest family relationships!

Earthly possessions are not harmful in themselves. It's our attachment to them that can take us away from love of God and neighbour. Along life's journey we become attached to things, ideas and habits. Over the years these attachments make us less free, less able to choose the good of others and to choose the way of self-giving love that marks the life of a disciple of Jesus. Attachments bind us to patterns of thought, action and habits that can be destructive to our dignity and to our relationship with God and neighbour.

God gives us freedom to liberate us from attachments that are harmful to body and spirit. God's gift of freedom removes the chains that bind us so that Jesus Christ can make us a new creation in him.

Today the word of God invites us to reflect on whether we are truly free to love God and neighbour. As we take stock of the habits and possessions that prevent us from experiencing true freedom to live in friendship with God, we pray in confident faith, "speak to me, Lord."

Lord, help me to be willing to die to self that I may rise with you to the eternal and glorious life.




The Season of Creation is marked throughout the Christian world from 1st September (the World Day of Prayer for Creation) to 4th October (the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi). It is a time to celebrate the joy of creation as well as raising awareness on what is happening to our common home.



The theme for the Season of Creation 2022 is "Listen to the Voice of Creation" and the burning bush is the symbol. Today, the prevalence of unnatural fires are a sign of the devastating effects that climate change has on the most vulnerable of our planet. Creation cries out as forests crackle, animals flee, and people are forced to migrate due to the fires of injustice. On the contrary, the fire of the burning bush that called to Moses as he tended the flock on Mt. Horeb (Exodus 3) did not consume or destroy the bush. This flame of the Spirit revealed God's presence and affirmed that God heard the cries of all who suffered and promised to be with us as we work for justice.

In this Season of Creation, this symbol of God's Spirit calls us to listen to the voice of creation, to the voices of those who suffer the impacts of climate change, to the voices of those who hold generational wisdom about how to live gratefully within the limits of the land. These are voices of the Earth. The global Christian family is called to awaken to the urgent need to heal our relationships with creation and with each other and to encourage our parish communities to do the same, "for we know that things can change!" (Laudato Si', 13).

O Creator God, in this month of creation time, teach us to see your footprints in the beauty of creation. Help us to listen to the voice of creation, inspire us to respect the rights of all people, and all living species, to share in your gifts today and to be always mindful of those who come after us. Lord hear us.
